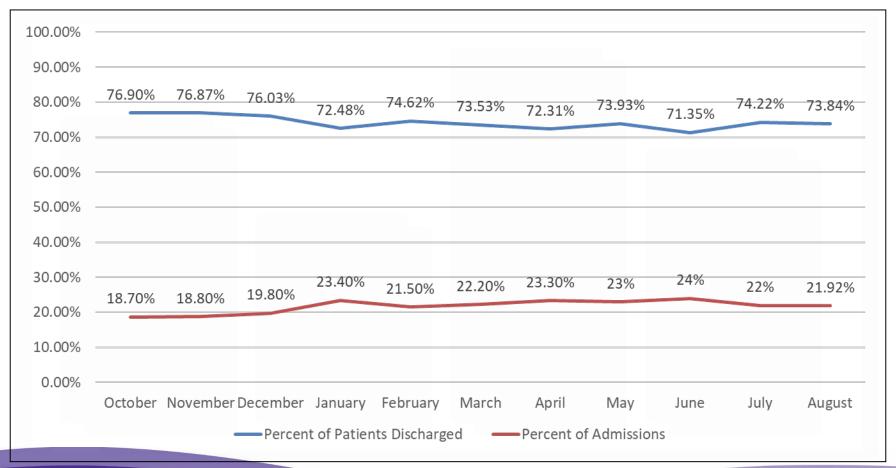

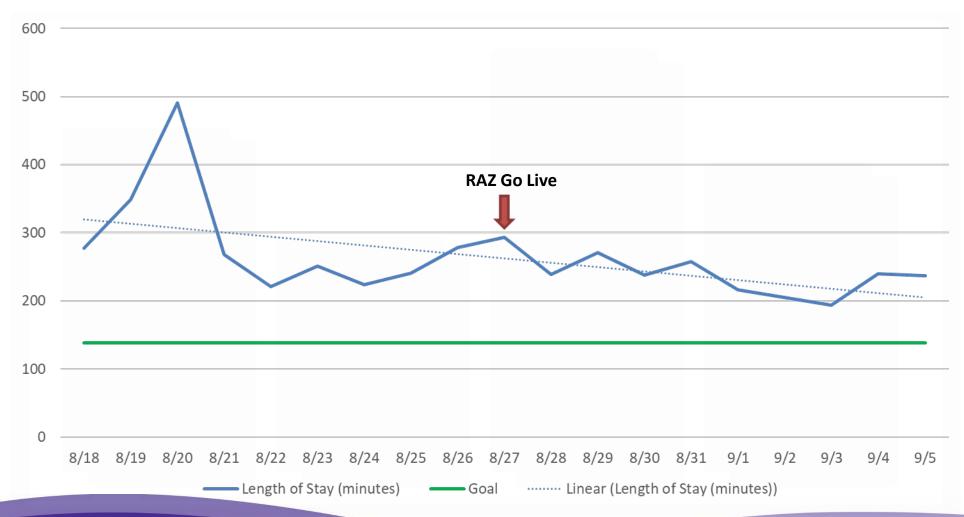

These volumes are linked to individual departments' budget, so any change in the major assumptions will affect all departments that would be impacted by that change.

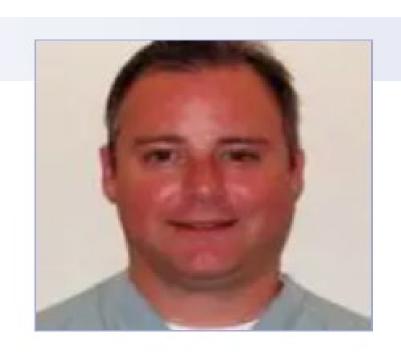
